




Use 0.38 mm thick Polypropylene Cut to 60cm x 36 cm (5:3) You will need a craft knife, ruler, pencil and eraser.



1. Make marks every 12 cm


2. Score diagonals in one direction






3. Score diagonals, turn over


4. Mark intersections as shown, using the scores from the other side as a guide.





5. Score the horizontal lines. Fold all the creases firmly. The mountain folds will be on the scored sides.

6. With the horizontal folds as mountains facing up, roll up the lantern, popping out the creases as you go. The two shaded aress will overlap.









7. Apply superglue on the overlapping areas, and apply clamps until the glue sets.
